Extensive support for energy efficiency and renewable energy


Maximizing access to energy for all, especially the rural poor

ADB Energy for All's goals are drawn from ADB's 2009 Energy Policy which sets as one of its pillars: "maximize energy for all, especially for the rural poor."



ADB SUPPORT FOR BIOGAS PROJECTS

PRC: Efficient Utilization of Agricultural Wastes Project

- The project has set up 19 100 biogas digesters, improved 130 920 m2 of kitchens, built 305 000 m2 of pig shed, 47 700 m2 of toilet.
- Construction of 15 large & medium-sized pilot biogas plants, construction of 18 rural markets for agricultural produce, development of over 500 km of rural roads, additional drilling of 113 wells.

Viet Nam: Quality and Safety Enhancement of Agriculture Products and Biogas Development Project

- Direct financial assistance for the construction of 20,000 household biogas units
- The Project will facilitate construction of about 40,000 household biogas digesters in 16 provinces
- The Project will provide a credit line managed by a number of partner financial intermediaries.
- It is estimated that the biogas component will reduce CO2 emissions by the equivalent of about 40,000– 60,000 tons of CO2/year and being developed as PoA of CDM

Viet Nam: Low Carbon Agricultural Support Project

- Project approved by ADB Board in December 2012
- 36,000 small biogas plants (Up to 50m3), 40 medium biogas plants (50 to 1000 m3) and 10 large biogas plants (More than 1000 m3)
- Plans are afoot to get carbon finance through regulated markets or voluntary markets
- Likely to save about 150,000 tons CO2e/yr

Bhutan: Rural Renewable Energy Development Project

- 70 per cent of the country lives in rural area
- Cooking and heating is the main energy requirement
- It has 1.2 t of fuel wood consumption per capita per year which is the highest consumption in the world (and twice as high as Nepal)
- Potential to have 16000 households that can have biogas in Bhutan
- ADB will support pilot domestic biogas plants (1,600 new households through microfinance)
- Total cost of the project US\$2.2 million
