

Examples of Partner Engagement Activities

This document provides examples of the activities Global Methane Initiative (GMI) Partners in which typically engage as important aspects of their membership. The list is not meant to be exhaustive, but rather is intended to provide a sampling of the ways in which Partners get involved, especially within their first year as a member.

Among other forms of engagement, Partners typically:

- Assign delegates to one or more Subcommittees.
- Identify an Administrative Liaison to act as the central contact point for all GMI issues.
- Develop a country methane action plan.
- Work with the ASG through the Administrative Liaisons to ensure an adequate flow of information between GMI and individual Partners.
- Review and approve a Partner profile on the GMI website.
- Provide information to the ASG on an ongoing basis to update the country and sector pages on the GMI website.
- Utilize the *Methane International* blog to highlight in-country methane mitigation projects, methane-related conferences, or other success stories.
- Undertake media outreach activities and provide the ASG with links to press releases or other news items for cross-posting on the GMI website.
- Translate GMI materials into Partner's native language, when relevant and possible.
- Work with the ASG to ensure that GMI is well represented at UNFCCC events (e.g., sponsor side events, display materials, secure booths).
- Distribute GMI materials and/or make presentations at relevant conferences or meetings, particularly UNFCCC events.
- Promote availability of GMI materials (e.g., infographic) to government officials and/or organization management.
- Utilize the GMI project tracking system to facilitate greater information sharing on projects and activities.
- Recruit in-country GMI Project Network members.
- Continue to better engage GMI Project Network members (e.g., solicit success stories, provide speaking opportunities, coordinate/hold concurrent meetings with industry events).
- Receive technical assistance from another GMI Partner and/or Project Network member.
- Provide technical assistance to another GMI Partner.
- Participate in one or more GMI subcommittee meetings.
- Participate in GMI sector-specific workshops and/or technology transfer meetings.
- Appoint points of contact (POCs) to work with ASG and other GMI Partners on specific events or activities as needed.
