
Strategic Priority 3: Position GMI as a "methane resource center"

Build capacity.	 Help countries to identify, implement, and promote national and subnational mitigation policies and programs to achieve methane emission reductions. Collaborate with Strategic Partners to assist in identifying financing opportunities. Work with financial institutions to lower the risk on methane finance. Consider how to promote/foster diversity (gender, age, geography, income, indigenous communities) in the methane mitigation space, such as through a declaration, statement, or communiqué. Foster diversity in academic work focused on methane mitigation, perhaps through financial support for research. 	Leadership, Steering Committee members, Subcommittees, Secretariat
Provide direct technical assistance. - GMI Steering Committee Chair meets once per year individually with Co-Chairs of each Subcommittee to get feedback and input.




