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## **U.S.** Activities Update

- Cooperation with the UNECE on the Best Practices Guidance for Effective Methane Drainage and Use in Coal Mines
  - Document developed by panel of international technical experts; underwent two rounds of peer review.
  - Published in spring 2010 in electronic and hard copy. Also available via free download from UNECE website and hard copies in UN bookstores (English, French, Russian, Chinese).
  - UNECE will hold series of workshops to disseminate the Best Practices findings in China, Ukraine, and Kazakhstan.
  - US EPA supported development and publication of technical document and workshops in China, and planned in Ukraine, Kazakhstan.



## U.S. Activities Update (continued)

- Updated Global Overview of Coal Mine Methane Opportunities
  - Newly updated and revised (October 2010).
  - Profiles of 37 coal producing countries globally, including their current activities and potential for coal mine methane projects.
- International CMM Projects Database
  - Updated, revised information for 309 projects in 16 countries (September 2010)
  - User-friendly features allow searching and exporting data
  - Project information can be updated or added to database by global CMM community
  - New features added in 2010:
    - Greenhouse gas emissions reduction calculator
    - Default emission reduction values provided where projectspecific data are limited



# **U.S.** Activities Update (continued)

- International activities supported:
  - Capacity building activities in China, India, Mongolia, Poland and Ukraine
    - Efforts will continue in 2011
  - Pre-feasibility studies, technology demonstrations and assessments completed or underway in China, Mongolia, Poland, Ukraine
  - > Have awarded 17 grants since 2007
    - Will award several new grants in 2011, to be announced soon.



### **U.S. Activities Update: Country-Specific Highlights**

- China
  - US EPA has conducted 5 full-scale CMM project feasibility assessments
    - Study complete at Songzao mines
      - Based on study, Chongqing Energy Investment Group recently announced plans to build world's largest CMM to LNG facility
    - Studies complete at Liuzhuang and Hebi mines
    - Studies near completion (by December 2010) at Linhua Mine, Guiyang, Guizhou Province and Tai Xi Mines, Inner Mongolia



### **U.S. Activities Update: Country-Specific Highlights**

#### India

- Continued support for CBM / CMM Clearinghouse, hosted by Coal Mine Planning and Design Institute (CMPDI)
- Hosted a study tour to US CMM and CBM sites in July 2010 for CMPDI
- Recently generated VAM-specific data for several mines

### Mongolia

- Completed pre-feasibility study of potential CMM project at closed underground Nailakh mine.
- Based on study findings, Korean-Mongolian governments are sponsoring core drilling, gas resource assessment underway to evaluate potential CBM or CMM project
- Sponsored technical workshop on CMM in Mongolia (August 2010) in Ulaanbaatar for Mongolian government, coal industry officials



### **U.S. Activities Update: Country-Specific Highlights**

### Ukraine

- Held successful CMM Investment Forum in Donetsk in May 2010
- Developed 4 new coal mine profiles for The Handbook
  - Potential candidates for pre-feasibility studies
- Assisted policymakers with development of its strategy on CMM promotion and implementation of new CMM Law
- Plan for continued support in 2011



### **Key Domestic Activities in the U.S.**

- U.S. EPA finalized requirements for reporting of greenhouse gas emissions from key sources
  - Gassy underground coal mines required to report, with monitoring beginning 1 January 2011, and reporting beginning March 2012
  - Reporting of ventilation air methane emissions, drained gas emissions
  - Will help make U.S. emissions inventory more accurate



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
