Background

- Terms of Reference (Nov. 16, 2004) establishes sector-specific Subcommittees responsible for:
 - guidance and assessment of specific activities;
 - engage representatives of the private sector, multilateral development banks, researchers and other relevant non-governmental organizations;
 - develop a collaborative Action Plan.



Action Plan

- Specific elements of the Action Plan (TOR, Paragraph 3.4):
 - Overview of methane recovery and use opportunities and description of available technologies and best practices in the LFG;
 - Identification of key barriers and issues for LFG project development;
 - Discussion of market assessment and reform issues;
 - Identification of project finance opportunities and mechanisms;
 - Discussion of country-specific needs, opportunities, and priorities in the LFG sector,
 - Identification of possible cooperative activities to increase LFG methane recovery and use
 - Outreach to engage Project Network members



Landfill Subcommittee Activities

- Landfill Subcommittee has convened three times:
 - 17 November 2004 at the Ministerial Meeting, Washington:
 - 13 June 2005 in Torbay, United Kingdom
 - 2 4 November 2005 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.
- Working Approach:
 - Received input from committee members and Project network members
 - Incorporate the key elements proscribed by the Steering Committee
 - Priority was given to activities that have the greatest chance to achieve emissions reductions in the near term
 - Development of an Action Plan, living document updated on an ongoing basis
